Sensory integration therapy is a technique which uses different sensory strategies to improve the sensory registration and processing and to overcome the sensory problems. In sensory integration (SI) therapy, the kid (with SPD) is guided through the activities that challenge his/her ability to respond appropriately to sensory input by making a successful, organized response.

For school-based practice, sensory integration and praxis needs are addressed by assessment and interventions occurring in natural sensory-rich spaces. A sensory integration approach utilizes interactions between the OT and the student in a sensory-rich environment in a playful approach that allows for adaptation to novel challenges addressing reactivity, postural skills, praxis, and perceptual skills.

And many parents of children with sensory integration, or sensory processing, difficulties express concerns about their child ' s abilities to manage their emotions. A study by Cohn and colleagues (2014) found that 72 percent of parents whose children were referred to sensory integration therapy reported concerns for, or hopes of improvement in, their child ' s self-regulation ability.

Sensory regulation strategies are strategies which use the senses to help with regulation. These are often used to support individuals with autism and those who experience sensory processing differences. But in reality, they can be helpful for everyone. The goal when using sensory regulation strategies is to help the individual to regulate.

Ayres ' Sensory Integration intervention (or ASI) is a term used to describe intervention developed by Ayres to improve or develop sensory integration for children and adults with sensory integration difficulties. Therapists need specific training to understand the complex reasoning underpinning this therapy.

Provide a weighted lap pad, weighted vest, wiggle cushion, or other OT-approved sensory tools. Provide earplugs or noise-muffling headphones to help with noise sensitivity. Let the student use handheld fidgets; consider using a fidget contract. Have chewing gum available or attach a chewable item to the end of a pencil for a sensory-seeking student.

2 | Calming Tactile Input. There are many great ways to provide calming input through the tactile system. One simple tool that is easily used as a calming sensory break during the day is a tactile bin. Fill a shoebox-sized plastic container with sand, dry rice, or dry beans and let kids run their hands through it.

Sensory Diet Programs involving a daily routine/plan with a menu of individualized, supportive sensory strategies (e.g., rocking chair, quiet space, aromatherapy, weighted blanket), identified physical activities (e.g., yoga, swimming) and materials (e.g., sensory kits containing music, stress balls, items for distraction). These are used throughout the day as needed to help manage sensory modulation problems (e.g., touch, movement, visual or auditory sensitivity) and related emotions and ...
